East Side Arts Event 2022


During the Autumn term of 2022, the ten East Side schools were invited to submit artwork inspired by the brief 'Effects and Mitigation of Climate Change'. Burton Library kindly hosted a two-week exhibition followed by a presentation event which was held there on Saturday 26th November. The twenty-five pupils shortlisted (from a total of over three hundred entries) were invited to attend the event which was well supported. The Mayor and Mayoress of Burton selected twelve finalists from the exhibition based on both the art and an understanding of the brief. These artworks were used to create the Brizlincote Parish Council 2023 calendar. The overall standard was extremely high, and it was apparent that much thought had gone into the subject matter.

Family Nature Walk at The Hollows

We hope that our residents and visitors enjoy the "Brizlincote Family Nature Walk at the Hollows" which is now near completion. This small circular walk has been created to assist in enabling our smaller residents (and the bigger ones too!) to engage with and enjoy the local natural world which we are lucky enough to be part of.

Many thanks for the additional funding and support from Transforming the Trent Valley and the National Forest as we developed this Brizlincote Parish Council project. Thanks also to all our volunteers, suppliers and contractors who worked with us sympathetically to enhance this lovely space. We also appreciate the co-operation and assistance we have received from ESBC Open Spaces who we have worked alongside and who have included the amazing wildlife wood carvings which now populate the area!

Take your little ones for a picnic, to play and jump on the stepping logs and to use the rubbing posts to create images using your paper and pencils. We hope that older children will enjoy reading the informative and quirky facts on the **Interpretation boards** and looking out for the bat, bird, and insect boxes in amongst the trees as well as the descriptive style tree labels.

The Friends of Scalpcliffe Woods

Visitors to the woodlands may have noticed two new interpretation boards. Liaising with East Staffordshire Borough Council Open Spaces team, with grants from The National Forest and the Transforming the Trent Valley Partnership Scheme, we have been able to design and install one at each entrance. We hope the interpretation boards will help to promote further interest in the history and wildlife of this ancient woodland nature reserve.

We are proud to be the recipients of the Burton upon Trent Civic Society Environmental Award 2022 which was presented to us for raising the profile of the Scalpcliffe Hill Nature Reserve by our work between 2020 to 2022 raising funds, planting trees, facilitating the erection of signs at the entrances to the woods and other positive environmental works in the woods between 2020 and 2022.

Tower Wood Community Orchard

The Parish Council would like to thank Staffordshire Wildlife Trust volunteers, along with local volunteers, for their recent work in Phase 1 of Specialist Fruit Tree Pruning in the Orchard. This event was funded via The National Forest with the aim of enabling the community to have a free seasonal supply of both cooking and eating apples as well as pears available to residents; the fruit will become more plentiful as the trees benefit from the pruning and last year's newly planted trees mature. Climate Change

We have been advised that air source heat pumps, sometimes referred to as an air-to-water source heat pump, transfers heat from the outside air to water which heats your room via radiators or underfloor heating. It can also heat water stored in a hot water cylinder for your hot taps, showers and bath

Air source heat pumps are a type of renewable energy technology that take the warmth from the air outside and use it to heat the home. Because the air (or ground, or water) is heated by the sun, the energy technology takes the warmth from the air outside and transforms it to heat the home.

The energy that heat pumps produce is still classed as 'renewable', even though the pump itself is powered by electricity which may or may not have a renewable source.

There are two types of air source heat pump. Air to water systems are more common, they heat water which is then circulated around the home via radiators or an underfloor heating system. They can also be used to heat water in a storage tank for the bathroom or kitchen. Air to air systems typically use fans to circulate warm air around the home and cannot be used to heat water. We understand there are grants available to install air source heat pumps. The grant is called the Boiler Upgrade Scheme.
