### **Brizlincote Family Nature Walk at The Hollows**

We hope that you and your family enjoy the Family Nature Walk at the Hollows. This short circular walk, which is suitable for all abilities, has been developed with the focus on biodiversity within our local surroundings. Activities along the walk are particularly aimed at under 10-year-olds. We hope you and your families enjoy the picnic benches (which include disabled friendly and ease of access) and observing activity surrounding the many bird and bat boxes which we have installed. The first of our Interpretation boards, "Spirit of the River" offers guidance to local flora and fauna whilst signage indicates both the English and Latin names of some of the most important riverbank trees. Smaller visitors should take paper and crayons in order to enjoy the rubbing posts and we hope they will enjoy the relevant activities. Can you find the Stepping Logs along the tree line?

Congratulations to all the participants - they performed wonderfully. The event was also supported by performances from Edge Hill Academy's choir and an instrumental ensemble from Abbot Beyne School. Thank you to all those who attended and to those who helped, we hope you will agree that it was a success.



There were three winners, one from each age category and were announced on the day.

Congratulations to Joseph O'Dwyer from Edge Hill Academy whose acoustic guitar performance earned him the winners' certificate in the 6-10 years category.

Congratulations also to Rosa Bracewell and Calvin Pallet, both from Abbot Beyne School, winners of the 11-16 years and 17+ years categories respectively. Rosa impressed us all with her violin performance, and Calvin finished off the day's entertainment with a captivating flugelhorn performance.

### **Bluebell Planting**

The Parish Council facilitated a donation from ESBC of a few hundred green Bluebells for planting in Redwood Woods or the Tall Trees section of the Nature Walk as it is now known as. A group of volunteers from Leander Rise, set to and planted them in March. Although they might not flower this year it is hoped to bring colour in future years.

# **Benches for Brizlincote Parish**

As a Parish Council we are delighted to report that three benches have been installed at the following locations:

The locations are in response to suggestions from residents of Brizlincote and have been secured from our own funds and a small grant from East Staffordshire Borough Council.

### **Brizlincote Time Capsule**

Residents of Brizlincote were invited to submit their personal stories of daily life during the Covid-19 pandemic 2020-2021 for inclusion in the Time Capsule. Entries of art work from pupils of local schools which were submitted to Brizlincote Parish Council East Side Arts Competition during this period have also been included, as well as a current Burton Daily Mail and Parish newsletters.

On behalf of our residents, we would like to thank both The Burton Bridge Brewery for donating this amazing vessel and to AGC Welding for their fantastic work in modifying it to become a suitable Time Capsule located within Brizlincote Parish for future generations to discover.



## Friends of Scalpcliffe Woods

We continue to investigate what is living in the nature reserve. Our efforts at small mammal trapping led to a number of field mice being recorded, mainly in the woodland section and we know local residents have spotted voles and shrews. Two very successful 'Fungus Forays' revealed an amazing 55 different species of fungi, with our visiting expert noting some important finds.



We were very pleased that the 'Wellies' group, based in Sudbury, having made bird boxes kindly installed some in the woodland. One of our members also made bird boxes that are now installed, ready for the nesting season.

Our most recent group activity involved clearing brambles so we could plant oak whips to contribute to the Queens Green Canopy initiative celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.
